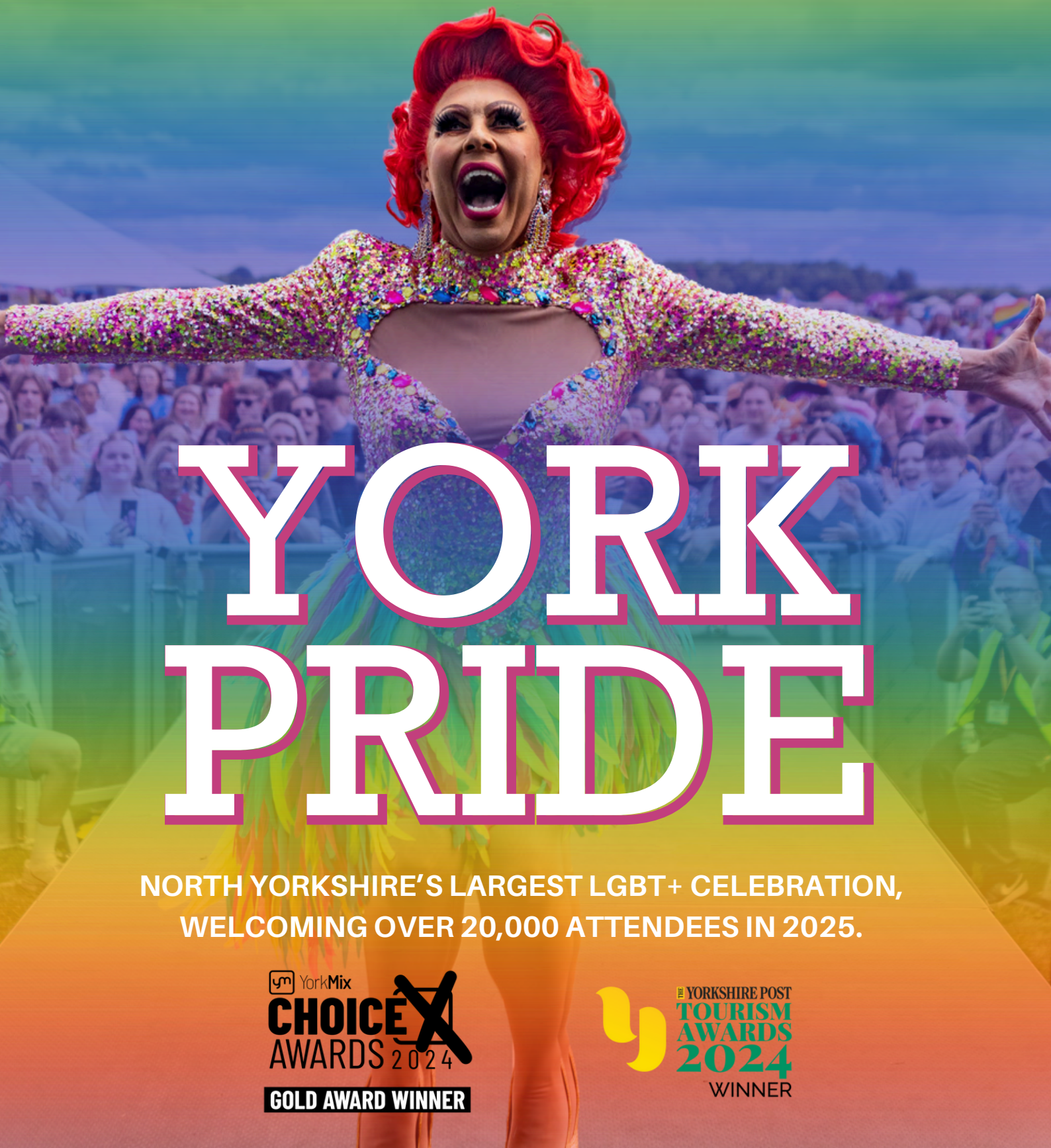

## Stall Categories

### **LOCAL CHARITY & COMMUNITY**

Minimum donation £80 (£40 York registered LGBT+ charity or group)

### **TRADE UNION & NATIONAL CHARITIES**

(This includes local branches of national charities)

Minimum donation £200

### **CRAFT/MAKERS**

Minimum donation £120

### **LOCAL BUSINESS/ RETAIL**

Minimum donation £200

### **LARGE BUSINESS/CORPORATE\***

Minimum donation £1500

### **HOT FOOD**

Minimum donation £600+

### **DESSERTS & TREATS**

Minimum donation £300+

### **NON-ALCOHOLIC DRINKS & COFFEE**

Minimum donation of £300+

\* We class any business with over 250 employees nationally as Large

Minimum donation amounts are a guide. If your business or group can afford a little more it is appreciated and goes towards covering our £130,000+ running costs each year!



## A few things to consider

- Stall position is at the sole discretion of York Pride; we aim to prepare a site layout that benefits traders and attendees equally.
- We do not provide gazebos, chairs, tables, etc.
- The standard pitch size is 3m x 3m
- There will be a 25% uplift in donation for a 6m x 6m pitch, 50% uplift in fee for a 9m x 6m pitch and 75% uplift for a 12m x 6m pitch.
- We aim to provide a good mix of vendors and avoid having numerous stalls with the same product(s).
- We've found that attendees like to support stalls who take part in our Wristband Scheme and also stalls that are interactive.
- The whole site will be licensed for trade under one licence from City of York Council. If you are selling food or drink you will have to pay an additional licence fee of £50 on top of your pitch fee. (This is much cheaper than if individual traders had to obtain their own licence.)

## Terms and Conditions 2026

1. The closing dates for applications will depend on the number of applications we receive. We may close applications for certain stall categories but leave them open for others. Please see our website for details.
2. Successful applications for a stall will be invoiced, with payment due within 30 days otherwise bookings will be offered to other stallholders.
3. Stall space is a standard size of 3m x 3m. If your stall will vary from this please select the appropriate option within your application.
4. Stalls will be allocated positions at the sole discretion of York Pride. The position given is non-negotiable as all stalls will be placed for maximum benefit of the trader and patrons.
5. No stall is guaranteed a 'good view of the stage.' We anticipate you'll be too busy to notice anything past your queue of eager customers!
6. York Pride will charge all stalls who are selling food or drink an additional £50 licence fee on behalf of City of York Council. We have an occasional Street Trading Consent Licence for the site, which means individual retailers do not need an individual licence.
7. It is the sole responsibility of all stallholders to have the appropriate health and safety certificates and public liability insurance. Copies of these will need to be sent to York Pride in advance, and also displayed upon your stall.
8. Catering, Food & Drink vendors must provide their own power/generators, water and are responsible for all waste, including from customers within their radius. (We are only able to allow diesel generators — Petrol generators are not permitted.)
9. Stallholders must provide a gazebo/marquee type structure, along with appropriate tables. York Pride only supplies the given dimensions of field space requested. York Pride does not have any surplus equipment available for traders to use.
10. York Pride is an open-air event on a grass field. Please come prepared for all weather conditions. The site can be uneven in places. No traders will be allowed an early exit due to being unprepared.
11. Unless arranged otherwise in advance, you must arrive on site between 8am and 9:30am to set up.
12. All gazebo/marquee structures will be checked on the morning of the event. ALL stalls must be in place and ready to trade by 10am for inspection prior to the field's opening. Please don't forget your tent pegs!
13. Restrictions around vehicle parking for stallholders will be in place, with a designated Traders' Car Park away from the public. Vehicles are parked at the owner's risk.
14. There is no guarantee your vehicle will be parked near your stall.
15. If this will be an issue for you or you have a disability, please include this in the notes in your application; we will then do our best to accommodate close proximity to the parking area.
16. There will be a quiet/calm trading period between 11am and 12pm. No sound or music is to be played during this time.
17. Stalls must remain onsite and trading until at least 6:30pm. This is the earliest time for disassembly. We aim to have the site cleared by 8:30pm.
18. No vehicles are permitted to move around the public area of the festival site between 10am and 9pm. This is a requirement of our public liability insurance.
19. When taking down your stall, you will need to transport your items to the Traders' Car Park area. You will not be permitted to move your vehicle onto or around the public area of the festival site.
